Subject: Amendment to Bylaw 215

Hi Justine.

My name is Niki Roberts and I am the new Executive Director at Pender Island Recycle Depot. PIRS is appreciative of the revised definition you sent earlier to Richard, Kari, and Joyce in that the definition of a recycling facility has been amended to include re-use and public drop off, and we understand your reasons for not wanting to include reference to a collection facility under the BC Regs.

We would like to ask that one other small change be made, as shown in bold below, and that the term "residential" be included in the list of sources of origin for the materials that the Depot collects. This would ensure that materials that originate in residences can still be dropped off at the Depot by home support workers or other hired individuals dealing with domestic recycling.

"recycling and reuse facility" means the use of land, buildings or structures for receiving, storing, sorting, compacting and transferring recyclable materials that originate from **residential**, commercial, institutional, demolition or construction sources, as well as public drop off of household residential recycling.
