I would like to nominate Pat Ropars, Saturna Island's road maintenance foreman, for an Individual Community Stewardship Award. I know it is Pat's job to attend to the road in all types of weather good or bad, day or night, that is not why I am nominating him. It is the little extra things he does that cause me to write.

East Point, the area of Saturna Island where I live is sparsely populated at the best of times and much less in fall and winter. Coming home on the ferry during winter storms we know that Pat will have done a road check just before the ferry docks and the road to East Point will be open; if it isn't it soon will be. Pat instills in those of us out here a sense of being safe especially for the elderly who reside in the area. When the power is out if someone's generator is not running and it is obvious they are home there is a phone call from Pat to see if the person is ok, do they need a hand to get the generator going. Some who have slid into the ditch know that Pat will be able to assist them in getting back onto the road again. When clearing snow from the road, the bank of snow from the blade at the side of the road blocks driveways making exit difficult. Pat removes that bank from those who are elderly or infirm allowing people to easily get out of their driveways or emergency responders quick access. I worked nights at the Lyall Harbour end of the island for years and if it snowed while I was working Pat would phone to see when I was getting off work and he would clear the road ahead of me as I headed home. There were many occasions that there were only one or two residences occupied in that 13km's between home and work, and Pat doing his road check at that hour made sure I arrived home safely easing anxiety of myself, husband, employer and friends. I have phoned Pat on several occasions to report a dead deer lying at the side of the road or a top of a driveway along the roadway and within a very short time it is gone. Pat really does go the extra mile for us to make driving and walking on the road safe and enjoyable.
