SUBJECT: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE POSITION RE: UBCM RESOLUTIONS
(Annual Item)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Executive Committee endorses the positions to be taken at the September 2014 Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) meeting as indicated (or as amended) in the attached document entitled 'Island Trust Position on Selected UBCM Resolutions (2014)', subject to further information received at the UBCM Convention.

That the Executive Committee request that staff draft a letter for the Chair to the Bowen Island Municipal Council seeking direction on how Islands Trust Executive Committee members should vote on each resolution relevant to municipalities at the UBCM convention.

SENIOR STAFF COMMENTS: The Islands Trust Executive Committee attends the Union of BC Municipalities convention each year and votes on resolutions proposed by local governments across British Columbia. Trust Council's Policy 6.12.ii indicates that, when time permits, the Executive Committee will seek Trust Council's endorsement regarding its proposed position on those resolutions relevant to the Islands Trust. This year, UBCM and Islands Trust staff were unable to provide the information in time to enable Trust Council's consideration of the positions. Staff used their best judgment to select those resolutions most relevant to the Islands Trust mandate, policy statement, and issues affecting island communities.

ISSUE SCREENING:

1. Origin of issue: Islands Trust policy 6.12.ii on UBCM/AVICC Membership and Resolutions
2. Executive Committee decision is: mandatory due to policy
3. Issue is most closely related to Executive Committee Terms of Reference (6.1)
4. Related to numerous topics in Islands Trust Policy Statement
5. Related to a few topics in current Strategic Plan

IMPLICATIONS OF RECOMMENDATION

ORGANIZATIONAL: Members of the Executive Committee will vote and represent Trust Council while attending the UBCM convention, provided they are able to attend the relevant convention sessions.

POLICY: No implications for existing policy.

FINANCIAL: Costs of attending UBCM Convention are included in Trust Council's annual budget.

IMPLEMENTATION/COMMUNICATIONS: Executive Committee members will represent the Islands Trust Council at the UBCM Convention, as provided by Islands Trust policy 6.12.ii on UBCM/AVICC Membership and Resolutions. The suggested positions are recommendations only, as resolutions can be amended on the convention floor, or additional information may be provided before or during debate. Executive Committee members have the discretion to vote differently if necessary in order to represent the interests of the Islands Trust Area in a manner consistent with the object of the Islands Trust. Where resolutions would primarily affect Bowen Island Municipality (BIM), Executive Committee members will not vote unless they receive formal direction from the BIM Council. After Executive Committee's review of the attached table, staff will refer the BIM oriented resolutions to BIM Council for consideration. As BIM does not have another regularly scheduled meeting before the UBCM convention it is uncertain whether a response will be received before the convention.

BACKGROUND

Section 3.3 of the Islands Trust policy 6.12.ii on UBCM/AVICC Membership and Resolutions states:

When the Islands Trust receives UBCM's Resolution publication prior to its annual convention, the Executive Committee will review all resolutions to determine which are relevant to the object and jurisdiction of the Islands Trust and which it should support on behalf of the Islands Trust Council. The Executive Committee will solicit feedback from Local Trust Committees and the Trust Fund Board and, if time permits, will make recommendations to be endorsed at a Trust Council meeting. Members of the Executive Committee will represent the Islands Trust Council when proposed resolutions are put to a vote at the UBCM convention.

Staff received the UBCM resolutions book on August 20, 2014. Due to staff workloads and holidays, staff were unable to produce recommendations in time for inclusion in the September 2014 Trust Council agenda, so this briefing is for Executive Committee's consideration only.

On the attached document, staff have marked suggested positions on each resolution to be debated at the UBCM convention, currently marked as yes (Y), no (N), maybe (?), or BIM. The resolutions marked "Y" or "N" are those staff consider most relevant to the Islands Trust mandate, Policy Statement, and current issues in island communities, but Executive Committee members are free to add more. The resolutions marked "BIM" are of interest primarily to municipalities. Some resolutions seem unrelated to the work of the Islands Trust but may be of specific interest to individual island communities.

The Resolutions Committee has discretion in grouping resolutions from Parts 2 and 3 as:
