

Local Trust Committees in their work. He advised that the Trust Council meeting will be held in June and he invited the public to attend that meeting where there will be opportunity to provide input for the Strategic Plan.

4. TRUSTEES' REPORT

Trustee Busheikin reported on a meeting with the Comox Valley Regional District that she attended along with Trustee Graham, commenting that topics included the ferry-to-ferry trail and the Comox Valley Regional District's potential role as a service provider. She stated that she attended her first Ferry Advisory Committee meeting where the cable ferry and the impact on Denman Island fares were discussed.

She reported that since the last Local Trust Committee meeting she held an Trustee Office Day which provided the opportunity for discussions with guests, including the topic of affordable housing. She commented that in the Local Trust Committee office she located affordable housing documents from the past that could prove to be valuable information and pertinent to current discussions on the issue. She offered to review the documents and make a list for staff to assist in the affordable housing strategy project. Trustee Busheikin reported that she received the report on community consultation options from Ellen Bird, the Islands Trust student planner and noted that she will review the document and bring ideas from her review for consideration.

Trustee Graham reported that he met with the Agriculture Plan Steering Committee to review the second draft of the Farm Plan. He advised that the Plan will be reviewed again on May 28, 2012 at 9:30 am at the Marcus Isbister Old School, noting that the public is welcome to attend. He noted that the Plan may be on the agenda for the Local Trust Committee in June for comment and public engagement will follow.

Trustee Graham reported that he attended the Comox Valley Regional District meeting with Trustee Busheikin which provided an opportunity to share information. He advised that he attended the Association of Vancouver Island Coastal Communities presentations in Ucluelet and commented that he will talk about those presentations later in the agenda as it is relevant to the scheduled Delegations. He reported that since the last Local Trust Committee meeting he held a Trustee Office Day and will hold another on May 5, 2012 and encouraged anyone who may wish to discuss any Islands Trust matter to join him at that time. He advised that the next On Island Planner Day will be held on June 5, 2012.

The memorandum was reviewed and the allocation of the remaining \$100 was considered.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** that the Denman Island Local Trust Committee request staff to add \$100 to budget line 65230 Special Projects for the 2012/2013 budget cycle.

Advertising for the Local Trust Committee business meetings was considered. It was the consensus that the placement of notices in the Grapevine calendar was effective and would continue, while the advertisement of the regular Local Trust Committee meetings in the Grapevine would be discontinued in the interest of budget considerations.

Chair Luckham noticed that the advertising expenses from last year for the Official Community Plan review were quite large and he asked if this was correct. He commented that he would follow-up on this question.

Planner Simpson summarized the contents and purpose of the memorandum.

- 6.4 *Denman Island Bylaw Enforcement Policy for Guest Accommodation Staff Report dated April 16, 2012*

Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew summarized the staff report, providing the background, summary of issues and recommendations. He explained the rationale for the suggested enforcement policy for guest accommodation. He advised that although the proposed bylaw enforcement policy includes an expiration clause that can be renewed, he recommended that the bylaw regulation review be undertaken in a timely manner rather than renewing the proposed enforcement policy multiple times.

Chair Luckham noted that Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew had responded to the request for an enforcement policy for guest accommodation in a thoughtful manner, producing a well-crafted recommendation. He indicated that this issue needs to be approached cautiously as bylaw enforcement policies undermine the bylaws which were designed by the community over a lengthy period. He noted that if the proposed bylaw enforcement policy is adopted, the Local Trust Committee will need to ensure that the community's interests are being reflected and that if necessary, changes are made to the bylaw to address the issue.

Trustee Graham noted that the input being received indicates that the bylaw is not reflecting the needs of guest accommodation operators. He presented his viewpoint that an enforcement policy for guest accommodation could provide opportunity for continued discussion and possible fine-tuning of the bylaw. He confirmed that the recommended policy does not imply the permitted use of guest accommodations as short term vacation rentals. He stated his support for the proposed bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation as presented.

Trustee Busheikin thanked the guest accommodation operators for coming forward with concerns and expressed her support for a review of guest accommodation bylaw regulations. She indicated that she is not in general support of a bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation to restrict enforcement to certain circumstances, and would prefer to first have a process

with clearly identified, wide community support and multiple opportunities for public input. She commented that she is eager to address the issue in the proper way and might support the recommended bylaw enforcement policy with a shorter expiration date. She noted that this would allow some time to continue the process of community discussion and investigation into possible implications of bylaw changes while sending the message that operators need to make their business decisions on the basis of the bylaw not the enforcement policy.

Trustee Busheikin inquired as to why item 2.2 in the proposed bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation requires a written complaint by owners or residents of two properties. Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew explained that having complaints from two neighbours mitigates the possibility of unfounded complaints and serves as a verification mechanism. He considered that the clause does specify that the written complaints are to be about bona fide serious nuisance issues which could be enough to satisfy the cause for investigation with a complaint from one neighbour given that it is a small, rural community.

Chair Luckham suggested that “without notice” might be added to item 3 of the proposed bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation after the text that indicates that the Local Trust Committee may change this policy at any time and may give direction to expand enforcement activities at any time.

The Local Trust Committee invited comments from the public.

Morley McKeachie, Denman WORKS! – stated that one reason this issue has been brought forward is that there were six enforcement notices that were sent out, instigated by the bylaw enforcement officer and not by complaints and he asked for verification of that.

Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew responded that the bylaw enforcement actions were in response to complaints and confirmed that they had not been initiated proactively.

Morley McKeachie, Denman WORKS! – suggested that complaints might be monitored during the period of the proposed enforcement policy of guest accommodation. He confirmed that it is not the intention of Denman WORKS! to rush the implementation of change, rather a full public input process was supported. He recommended an expiration date of December 31, 2012 for the proposed enforcement policy.

Margie Gang – asked if the review of the regulations is likely to be on the Local Trust Committee work plan within a year.

Trustee Busheikin responded that she intends to recommend that review of guest accommodation regulations be put on the projects list however it is difficult to say when it could be addressed.

Margie Gang - asked if “suspended” is the correct term to use to describe the proposed bylaw enforcement policy actions and asked for clarification of the term to be used.

Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew clarified that the bylaws are not being amended. He advised that the bylaw enforcement policy is not suspending, but rather restricting enforcement to certain circumstances.

Margie Gang - asked for clarification of “public consultation”. She noted that this issue has been advertised, it has been discussed at Local Trust Committee meetings and added that there was a Denman WORKS! delegation. She suggested that there is a small group that is directly involved in this issue and expressed the viewpoint that if a large, well advertised community meeting was conducted, the attendance would be low. She indicated she would like to see the Local Trust Committee focus on what we do want to see, not what we do not want to see.

Chair Luckham responded that the Official Community Plan is the visionary document that expresses what this community wants to look like and the bylaws are the regulatory mechanism to permit the vision. He agreed with the perspective on positive focus.

Henning Nielsen – expressed his viewpoint that there is merit in looking at guest accommodation regulations that affect some groups, however in the interest of bringing capital to Denman Island it may be time to review the more fundamental issues.

Harlene Holm – spoke against the Denman WORKS! motion to alter the guest accommodation bylaw regulations, stating that their proposal would increase density based on tourist services and provide a benefit to a specific group without community discussion of the issues. She cautioned that the impacts and possible abuses of permitting commercial suites and houses should be carefully considered and the Islands Trust legal counsel consulted. She asked that community discussion be held on the topic and requested that those supporting a change in the bylaw explore the issue further and to consider that this is a controversial issue.

Graham Brazier – spoke against the proposed bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation, stating that the community should consider the issue first, that it benefits the financial interests of a small group, and that it may encourage those in the tourist services to make business plans based on it. He commented that the decision should be based on input from the whole community not from a small group and that he considered that a broad determination of these aspects of the bylaw would be warranted.

Wes Ritter – noted that on numerous occasions the Local Trust Committee has advised that it would conduct a housing review prior to enforcement changes. He expressed his opinion that rather than offering exemptions, proposed Bylaw No. 201 should be defeated.

Ralph McCuaig – spoke about a faltering economic base on Denman Island and the benefits of the economic spin-off, including employment, that occur from the guest accommodation service industry. He stated that he recently attended a Tourism BC workshop which had a focus on creating a viable economic future

and he wanted to encourage a positive outlook while acknowledging that Island Trust reviews take time.

Bill Engleson – expressed his concern that the most serious, persistent issue on Denman Island continues to be housing which is not being addressed sufficiently by the Local Trust Committee. He reported that an Age Friendly report will be coming soon which identifies housing and transportation as being the major issues. He encouraged people to participate in that community project.

Veronica Timmons – noted that currently there is no data available to identify the number or type of visitors that come to Denman Island, how long they stay or how much they spend while here. She suggested that in order to grow, that data needs to be collected. She reported that a proposal to assist in gathering that information is being prepared for submission to Denman WORKS!

DE-041-2012

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED**:

1. That as the Denman Island Local Trust Committee intends to review the home based guest accommodation regulations in Bylaw No. 186 bylaw enforcement activity is restricted where the guest accommodation provides the following unlawful facilities:
 1. a second set of cooking facilities is provided in a lawful dwelling for the use of guests;
 2. accessory buildings are used as bedrooms for guest accommodation provided that no more than three bedrooms exist in total;
2. That despite section 1 and 2 above bylaw enforcement activity will not be restricted if:
 1. there are issues related to health, safety, or environmental damage;
 2. there is a written complaint about bona fide serious nuisance issues such as noise or parking congestion related to the guest accommodation;
3. That nothing in this enforcement policy should be interpreted as giving permission to violate the Land Use Bylaw and the Denman Island Trust Committee may change this policy at any time and may give direction to expand enforcement activities at any time without notice;
4. That unless the Denman Island Local Trust Committee extends the effective period on this enforcement policy it expires on December 31, 2012 or when the guest accommodation regulation review is complete, whichever is the sooner.

CARRIED

Prior to voting, there were comments from Trustee Busheikin and Chair Luckham. Trustee Busheikin acknowledged that the discussions and comments from those present have helped to explore the complexities of this issue. Chair Luckham advised that the proposed bylaw enforcement policy for guest accommodation is a short-term working solution to the issue and expressed his discomfort with making adjustments to bylaws in this manner.

After the vote, Trustee Busheikin encouraged Denman WORKS! to use the time provided by the bylaw enforcement policy on guest accommodation to gather statistics and to consult with voices in the community on the subject.

The Chair recessed the meeting at 12:32 pm and reconvened the meeting at 12:35 pm.

6.5 *Bylaw Investigations Report
Briefing dated April 17, 2012*

Bylaw Enforcement Coordinator Drew summarized the report and responded to questions from the Trustees.

6.6 *Email from Nancy Roggers dated April 26, 2012 regarding: Denman Expense Report – Final Year End to March 31, 2012 - Update*

7. APPLICATIONS AND PERMITS

There were no applications or permits.

8. DELEGATIONS

8.1 *Shelley McKeachie for Denman Marine Stewardship Committee regarding Local Trust Committee Work on Marine Issues*

Shelley McKeachie spoke on behalf of the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee in response to the staff report written for the meeting of April 3, 2012 addressing the review of policies and regulations regarding impacts of shellfish farming on the marine environment. She identified three harmful activities occurring on Denman Island beaches: the use of predator netting, driving on the beach and beach modification. She stated that the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee is requesting that the Local Trust Committee take action to stop these activities.

She outlined the efforts the group has undertaken during the past fourteen years to protect the marine environment. She explained that their advocacy work has not resulted in meaningful change and urged the Local Trust Committee to take action to preserve and protect the marine ecosystem, using their legal authority to regulate the harmful activities. She advised that the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee has obtained 221 signatures of community residents in support of this request.

Allison Isaak read a letter from Leah Bendell, Director, Environmental Science, Faculty of Environment and Professor, Biological Sciences, Simon Fraser University. The letter describes the safety hazard and negative ecological effects on Baynes Sound, the intertidal habitat, shore birds and sea ducks

resulting from the impacts of shellfish aquaculture. She requests the Local Trust Committee draft the necessary bylaws to protect this ecosystem.

8.2 *Edina Johnston for the Denman Island Forage Fish Group*

Edi Johnston spoke on behalf of the Denman Island Forage Fish Group. She outlined the harmful effects of predator netting on fish, migratory and indigenous birds and the biodiversity of the area. She stated that the netting creates hazards for other users on the beach and in the water due to improper maintenance. She explained that driving on beaches negatively affects spawning fish and their eggs, nesting birds and salt marsh areas. She spoke about the damage done to fish habitat when rocks are moved and streams modified by shellfish industry practices.

She indicated that the west shore of Denman Island has over 90% of its habitat impacted by shellfish tenures, creating a serious threat to diversity. She requested that the Local Trust Committee enact enforceable bylaws or zoning changes to preserve and protect the shores.

The Trustees thanked the groups for their work on these issues and responded that they will be discussing the subject further later in the agenda.

Trustee Graham reported that at the Association of Vancouver Island Coastal Community meeting he recently attended two presentations on aquaculture. He advised that there may be an opportunity to participate in a pilot project advisory group with the goal to effectively engage with Fisheries and Oceans Canada in the management of the aquaculture industry in a specific area, and that Baynes Sound might be considered for the focus area. He suggested that the Local Trust Committee give consideration to inviting Sean Herbert, Director, Provincial Program Delivery with the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations to attend a Local Trust Committee meeting in order to advance the prospect of participation in such an advisory group.

9. TOWN HALL DISCUSSION

Mariah Clark – wanted to remind people of the harm pollution does to marine animals and our health. She said that she attended the beach cleanup day in April and that there was a lot of garbage and there were dead animals on the beach. She explained that she is a member of the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee because she wants to help.

Patricia Mclaughlin – spoke in response to the staff report regarding the impacts of shellfish farming on the marine environment. She expressed her concern that the predator netting problems have been going on for too many years. She stated that beaches are public areas and she expects the industry to conduct their business in a way that does not put the community at risk. She commented that the unsecured netting is a hazard and makes her right, as an upland owner, to access deep water from the foreshore in front of her property in a boat dangerous and impossible without getting tangled in netting. She asked the Local Trust Committee to enact a bylaw that prohibits

the use of predator netting and to urge Fisheries and Oceans Canada to have tenure applicants remove netting as part of their management plan.

Margie Gang – asked what the requirements are for something to be a public consultation, and what can individuals do to create that process.

Planner Simpson responded that the only legislative requirement for public consultation is for a public hearing to be held in the process of adopting a bylaw although in practice it happens earlier. She explained that applicants in rezoning applications are advised to have some form of public consultation in the process which might be a community information meeting with a record of attendance and comments that can be forwarded to the Local Trust Committee for information.

Trustee Graham added that there have been occasions when these community meetings are held before an application is made, providing information about the project and an opportunity for questions to be asked.

Morlie McKeachie – observed that the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee has tried to work with government agencies to resolve the concerns about the effects of the industry practices on the marine environment, however these agencies have a mandate to promote shellfish aquaculture. He expressed his opinion that he did not believe Trustee Graham's suggestion of participation in an advisory group would help.

Sharon Small – considered the idea that shellfish aquaculture in Baynes Sound is sustainable to be a myth that is being perpetuated. She stated that if we do not show the industry where it needs to be responsible, then we are participating in the perpetuation of the myth.

Elizabeth Johnston – stated that as an officer of the Denman Island Marine Stewardship Committee she has received hundreds of complaints about the shellfish industry however none have been addressed or taken seriously by regulatory agencies.

Chair Luckham commented that the Local Trust Committee can not enforce the Fisheries and Oceans Canada bylaws and observed that if the Local Trust Committee proposes bylaws that other agencies are not willing to respect, it creates a dilemma in that they will also be unenforceable.

Trustee Graham thanked everyone for their input and observed that Mariah Clark and Pat McLaughlin represent different generations with a common concern for the marine environment. He added that young Mariah's words were important and underscored the responsibility to care for the future of the beaches.

Chair Luckham recessed the meeting at 1:25 pm and reconvened at 1:44 pm.

12. LOCAL TRUST COMMITTEE PROJECTS

12.1 *Review of Policies and Regulations regarding Impacts of Shellfish Farming on Marine Environment*
Staff Report dated March 13, 2012

Planner Simpson indicated that the staff report contents had been discussed earlier in the agenda and there was no need to summarize the report further. She clarified that the recommendation to not proceed with amending the bylaw to prohibit driving on the beach or allow predator netting, rock walls, fences or metal structures was suggested from a determination that such an approach would not be effective. She indicated that this staff report represented a preliminary exploration of the issues and that a more detailed analysis could be done if desired, including enforcement options under the current bylaw.

Trustee Graham suggested that he would like to take an approach that includes a request for a staff report examining options including bylaw amendment, development permit area or utilizing existing bylaws to address removal of predator netting, banning driving on the foreshore and banning beach modifications. He also suggested that a meeting might be initiated with Sean Herbert, Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations; Corey Jackson, Fisheries and Oceans Canada; Bruce Joliffe, Comox Valley Regional District; Bill Veenhof Regional District of Nanaimo and staff to discuss these issues cooperatively.

Chair Luckham advised that another letter had been received from the BC Shellfish Growers' Association and their participation in possible discussions was considered.

DE-044-2012 It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** that the Local Trust Committee request staff to provide a report on bylaw enforcement mechanisms to a) remove predator netting b) ban driving on foreshore c) ban beach modification.

CARRIED

DE-045-2012 It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** that the Chair accept the invitation to sit on an advisory committee offered at Association of Vancouver Island Coastal Communities by Corey Jackson, Regional Manager, Aquaculture Program, Aquaculture Management Division, Fisheries Management Branch.

Planner Simpson summarized the staff report, the recommended options and the budget considerations for Riparian Areas Regulation mapping and community consultation on Denman Island.

Discussion followed on the recommendations for compliance and the benefits of participating in a northern working group.

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** that the Denman Island Local Trust Committee direct staff to proceed with:

- establishing a northern working group made of up northern trustees and staff in order to develop community consultation options and education materials for Riparian Areas Regulation implementation; and
- reviewing Development Permit Area 4 and prepare draft wording and mapping for compliance with Riparian Areas Regulation.

12.2.2 Riparian Areas Regulation Stream Identification of the Morrison Marsh System

The report was received. Discussion of the contract for mapping followed and it was confirmed that procurement policy was followed for the mapping of the Morrison Marsh system. Trustee Busheikin asked that future watershed mapping be tendered on Denman Island.

13. NEW BUSINESS

13.1 Local Trust Committee Annual Report Memorandum dated April 16, 2012

It was **MOVED** and **SECONDED** that the Denman Island Local Trust Committee accept the Annual Report as presented by Courtney Simpson as of April 16, 2012.

CARRIED

Discussion followed on the publication of this document to share the accomplishments of the Local Trust Committee with the community and an article in the Grapevine local newspaper was considered to be an appropriate

venue at this time. Future methods of disseminating information were considered and included the possibility of a link on the Denman Island page of the Islands Trust website to the Denman Island Annual Report and hyperlinks within the posted Annual report linking to Denman Island.

13.2 Upcoming Meeting with Sean Herbert of Ministry of Natural Resources Operations regarding Aquaculture Regulations

Planner Simpson reported that, as directed in a previous meeting, staff has invited Sean Herbert and a representative from Fisheries and Oceans Canada to meet with the Local Trust Committee. A response has not yet been received from Fisheries and Oceans Canada, however Sean Herbert has accepted the invitation and has requested a detailed outline of topics to be discussed.

Trustee Graham suggested that Sean Herbert be informed that the Local Trust Committee appreciates his acceptance and is awaiting response from a representative from Fisheries and Oceans Canada before proceeding further.

The timing of a possible meeting with Sean Herbert and Corey Jackson was discussed and it was determined that it would be most effective to schedule this meeting for a time when a draft bylaw might be available for discussion so that options can be presented in a positive manner.

14. BYLAWS
