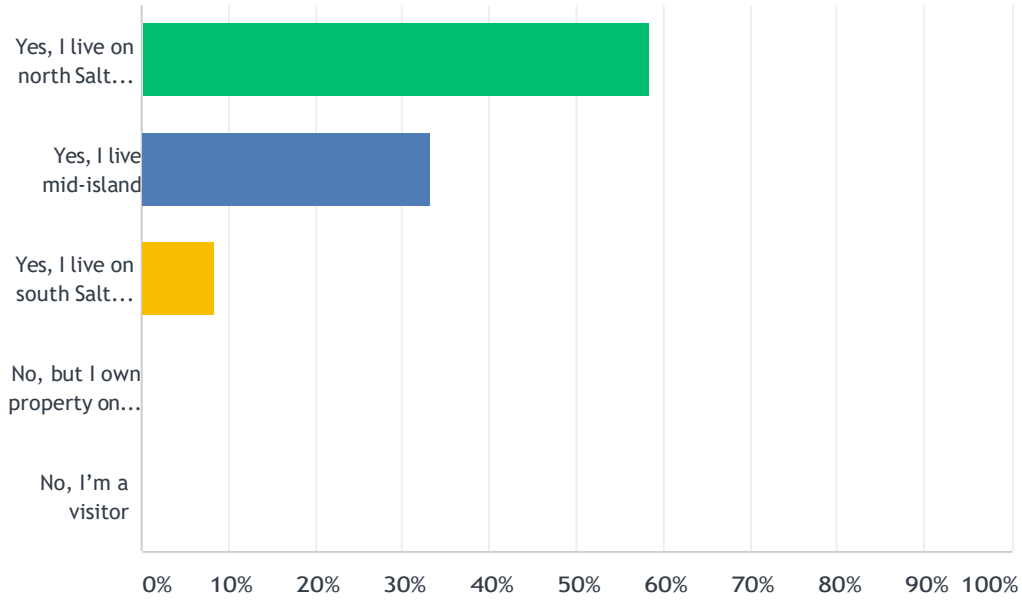


## Q1 Are you a resident of Salt Spring Island?

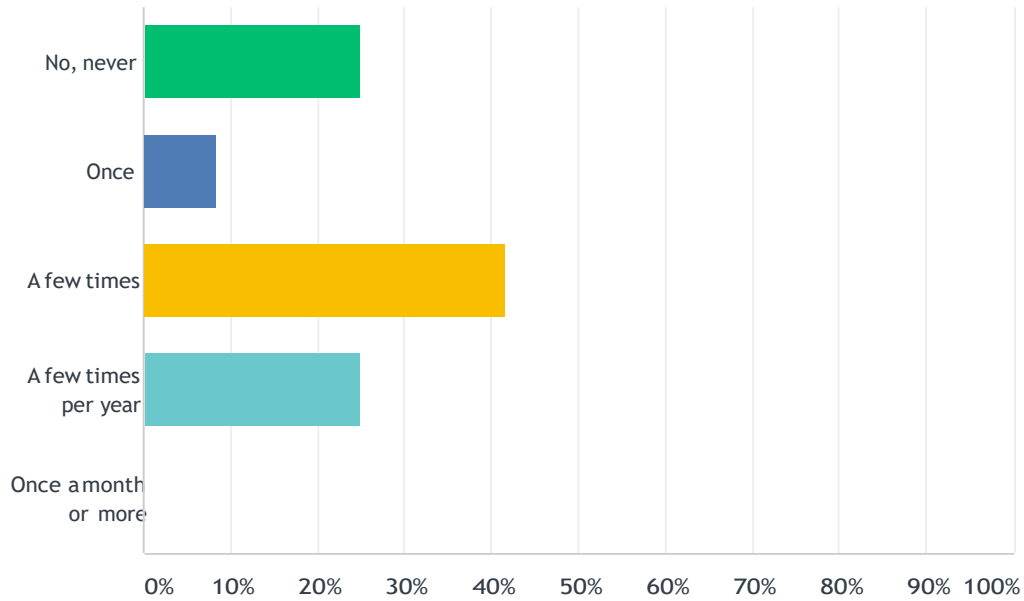

## Q2 Have you ever visited Deep Ridge Nature Reserve? If so, how often?

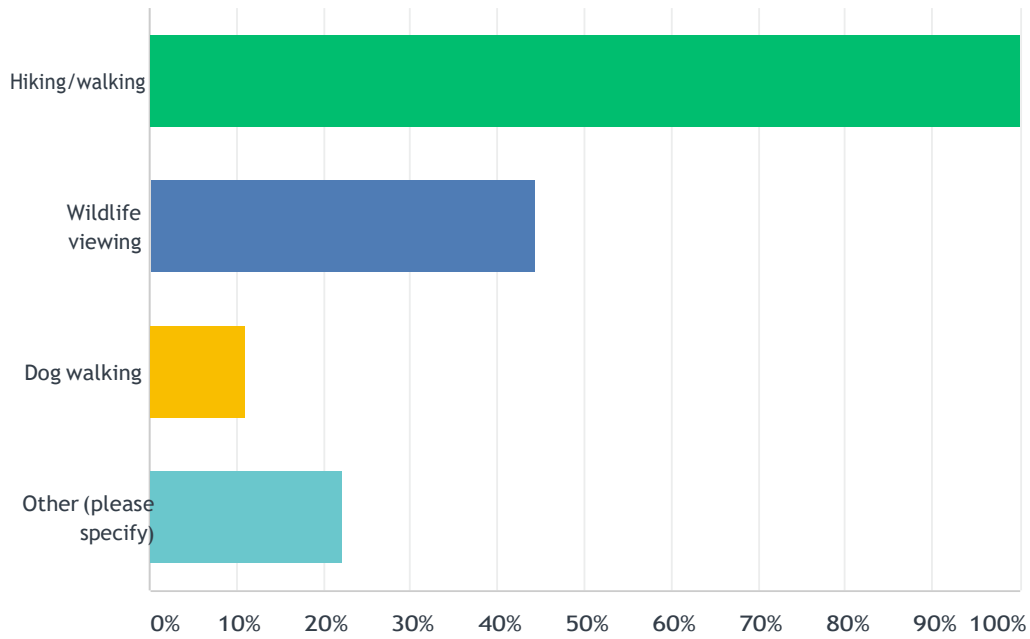

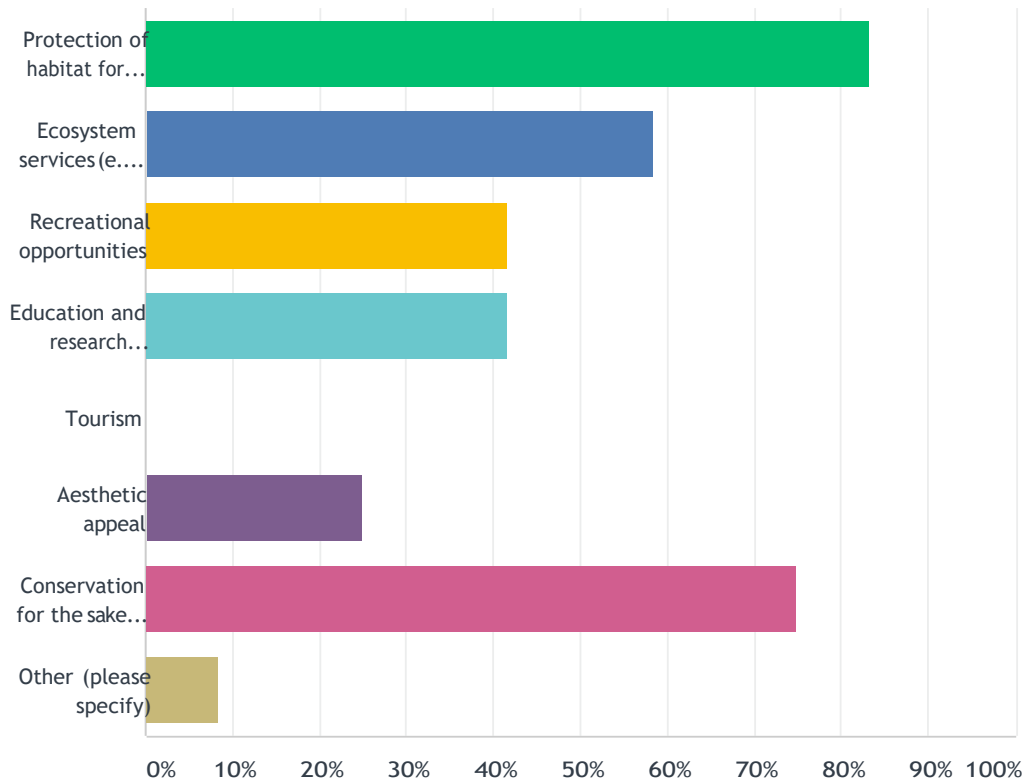
