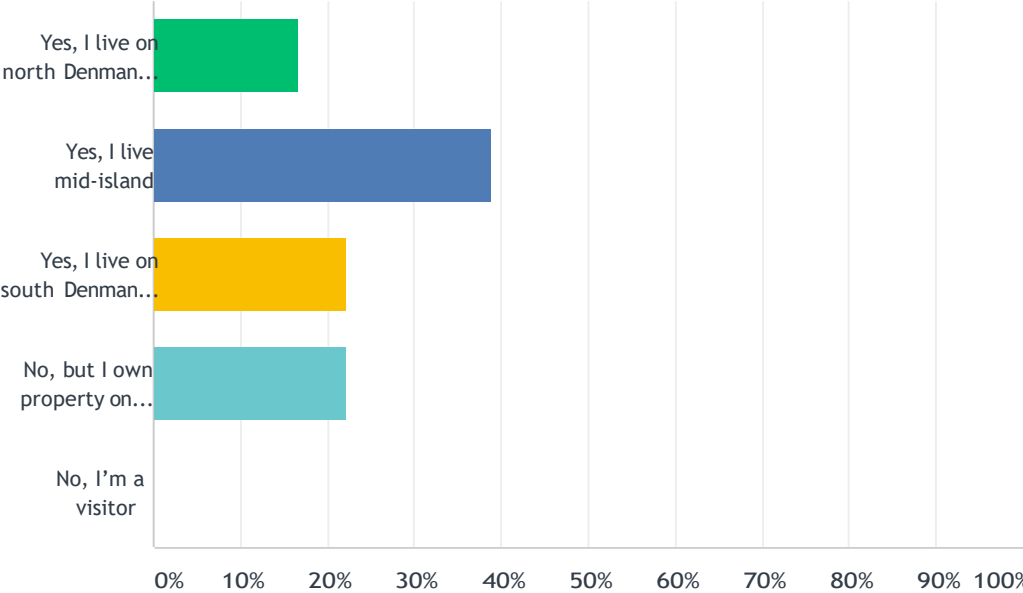


### Q1 Are you a resident of Denman Island?

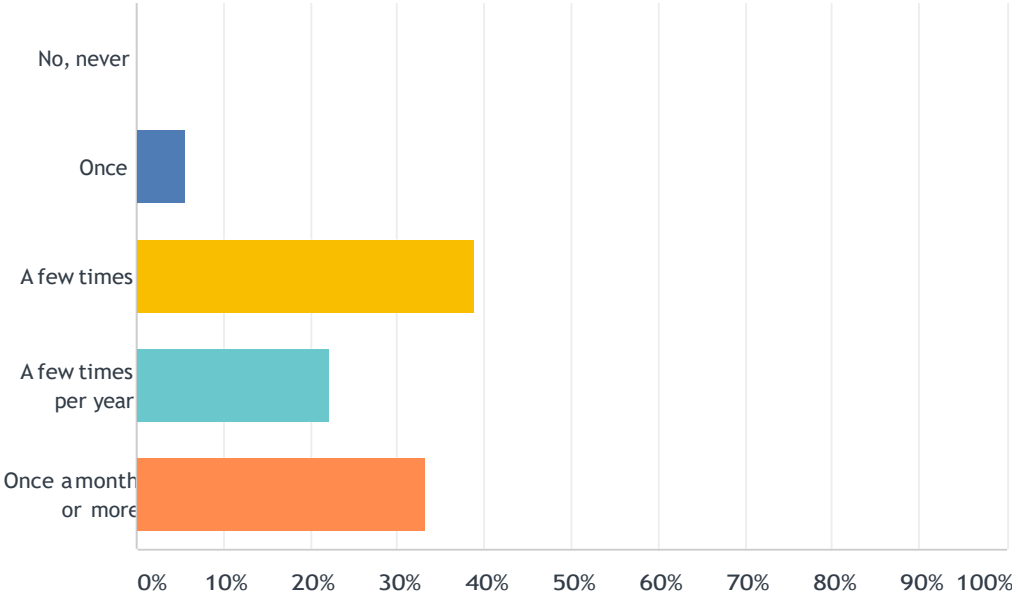

## Q2 Have you ever visited Lindsay Dickson Nature Reserve? If so, how often?

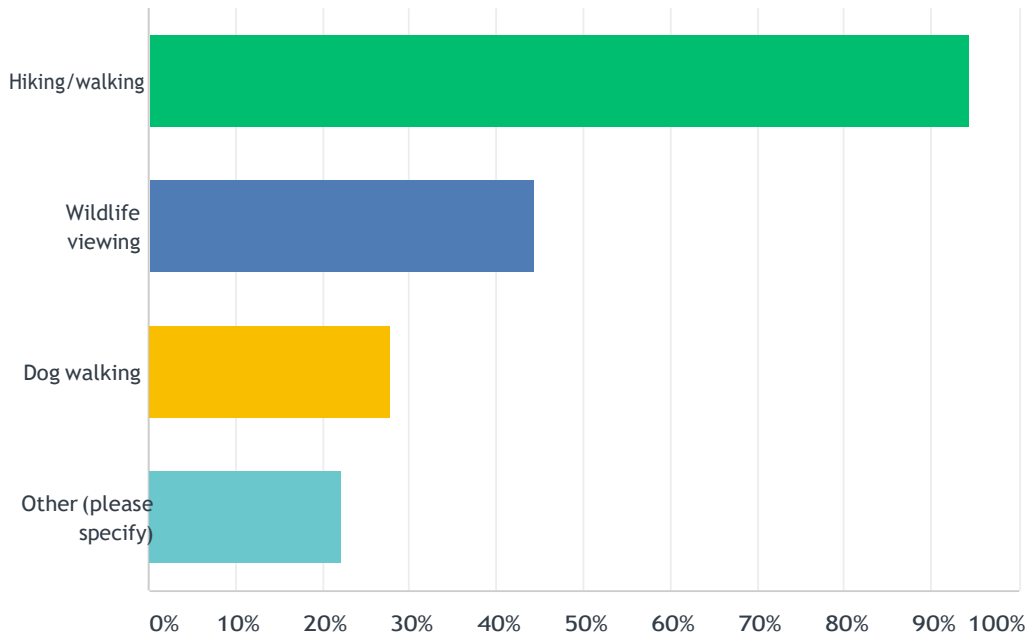

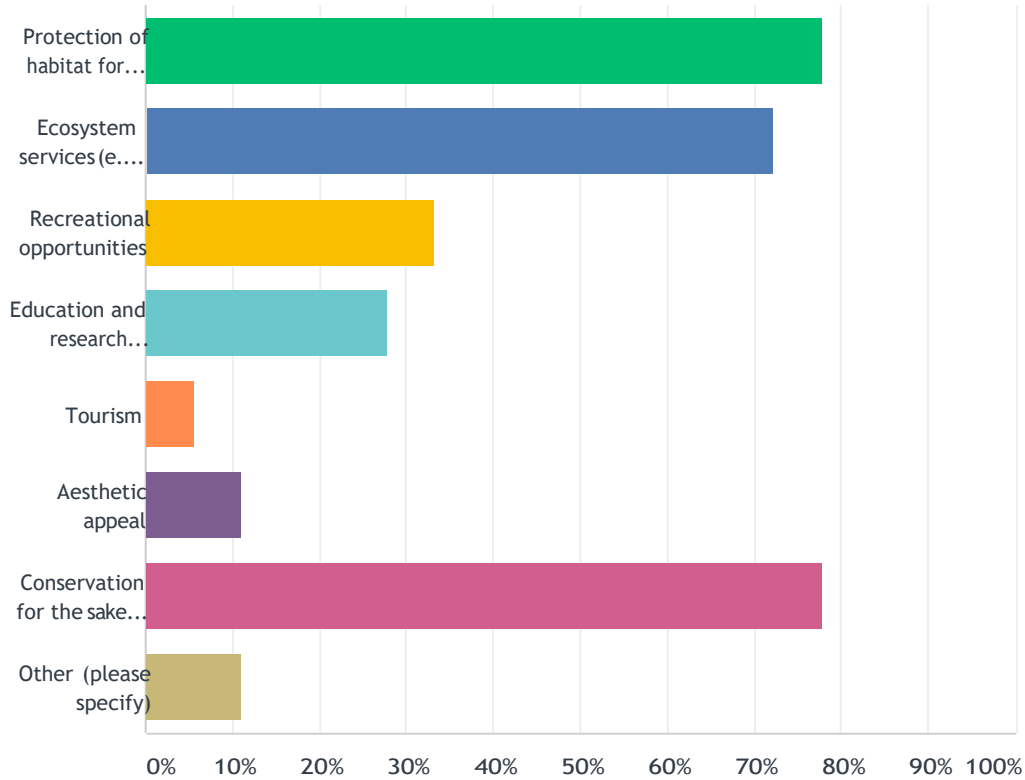
