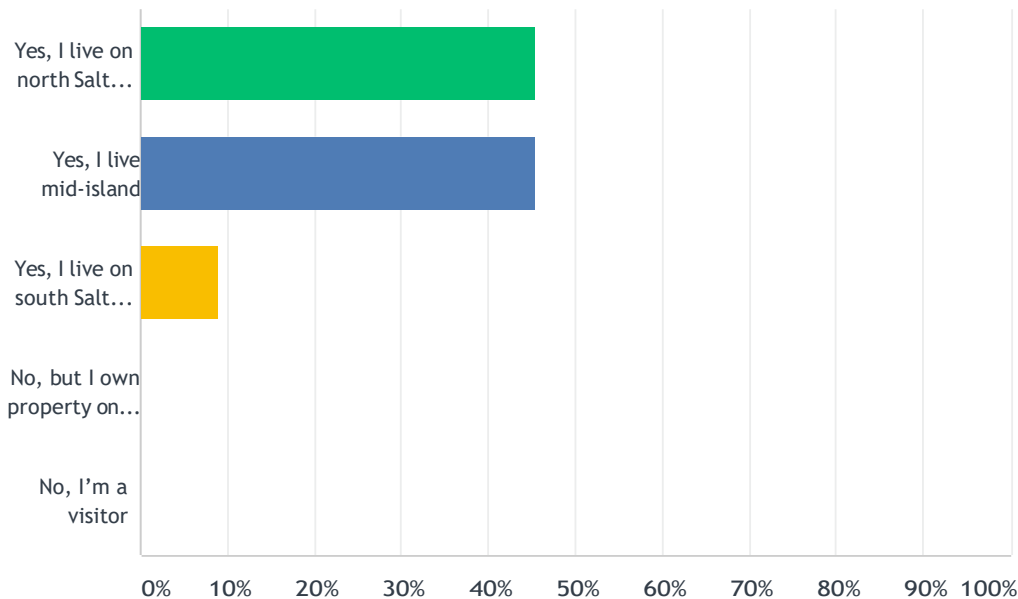


Q1 Are you a resident of Salt Spring Island?

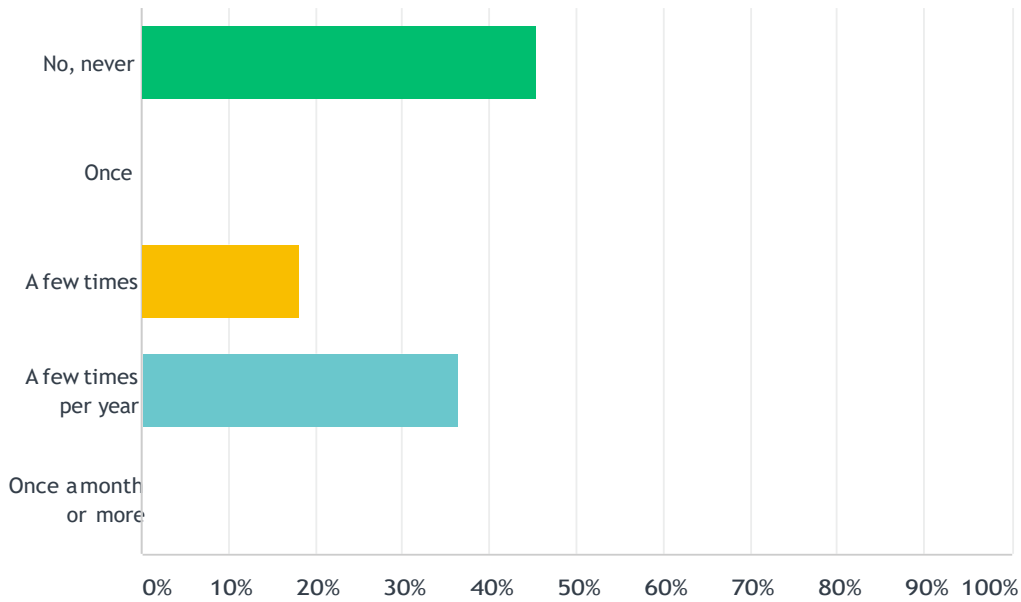

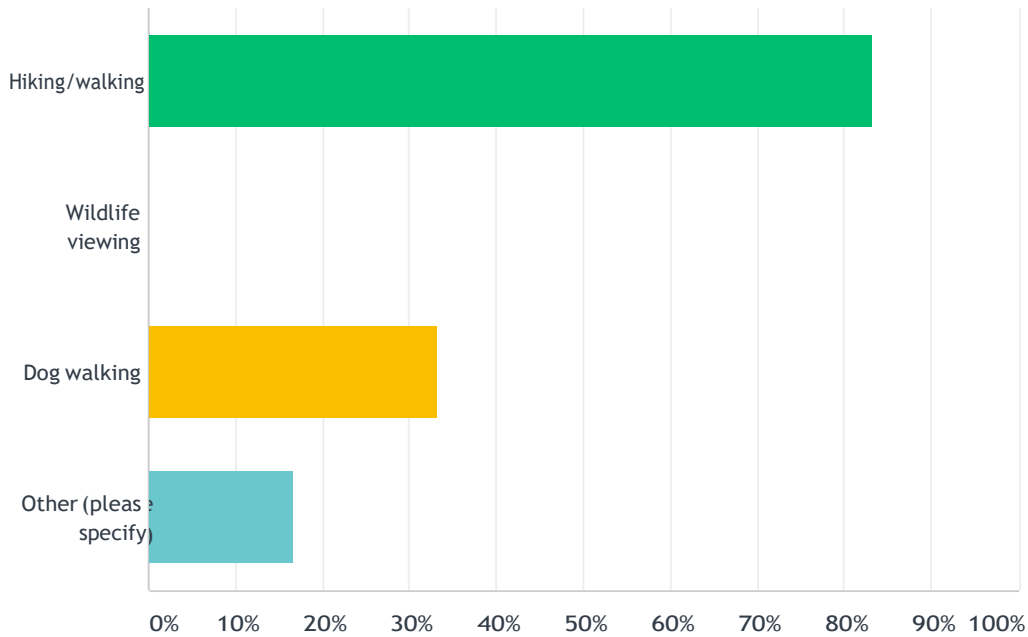

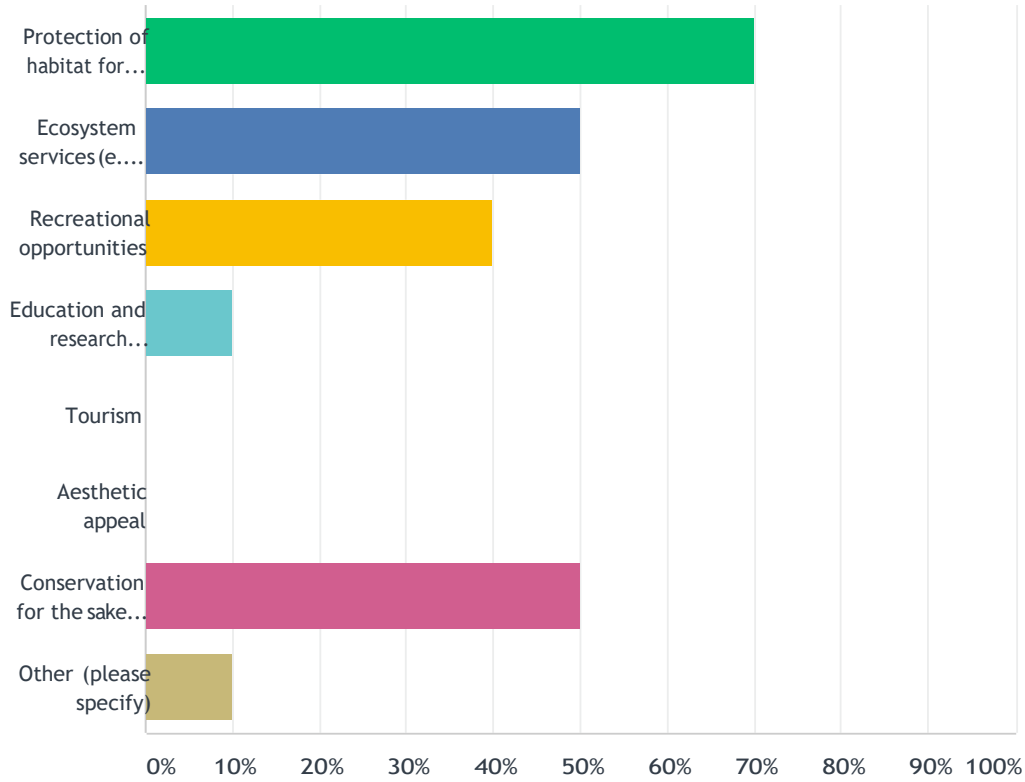
