Protection of the Coastal Douglas-fir Zone on Salt Spring Island

What is this project about?

The Coastal Douglas-fir (CDF) zone describes a unique set of ecosystems found only on southeast Vancouver Island, the Gulf Islands, and the southwest coast of BC. These ecosystems include Douglas-fir forests, as well as Garry oak woodlands, wetlands, estuaries, and other unique communities of plant, animal, and fungi found nowhere else in the world.

CDF ecosystems are highly endangered. Less than 1% of the CDF zone in British Columbia remains in old growth forests and 49% has been permanently altered by human activity.

The Salt Spring Island Local Trust Committee (SSI LTC) has committed to exploring options to better protect these unique ecosystems on Salt Spring Island.
